The Resource Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County (RRRASOC) is a municipal solid waste authority that helps its member communities provide cost-effective, environmentally responsible and convenient waste and recycling programs, including recycling drop-off centers, curbside recycling collection, and household hazardous waste collection events.

We are often referred to as **The Recycling Authority** for short or by the acronym **RRRASOC.**

Member communities include Farmington, Farmington Hills, Village of Milford, Milford Township, Novi, South Lyon, Southfield, Walled Lake, and Wixom.

HOW TO RECYCLE IN YOUR COMMUNITY

Single family households in RRRASOC communities have weekly curbside recycling collection provided by their contracted waste hauler, Waste Management or Priority Waste. Once collected, recyclable materials are delivered to the RRRASOC Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in Southfield to be sorted, separated, baled and shipped to end markets.

PREPARING YOUR RECYCLABLES:




DON'T BAG THEM; leave them loose



Break down cardboard boxes to save space

Return grocery bags to stores for recyclina



Flattened Cardboard, Clean Pizza Boxes, & Wrapping Paper No grease or food; no glitter or foil on wrapping paper.



Paperboard Boxes, Paper Cups, & Paper Bags No foam/foam-lined cups; throw away stirrers, lids, and straws.



Milk, Juice, & Soup Cartons Throw away straws, lids, and caps. Ice cream cartons are not accepted.



Office Paper, Folders, Mail, Magazines, Newspaper, Paperback & Phone Books

Staples and labels are okay. No clips, spiral notebooks, or hardcover books.



Garden Plastics Remove soil and plants.



Plastic Jugs, Bottles, & Containers: **#**1, **#**2, **#**4 – **#**7 Leave lids and caps on. No packaging foam.



Bulky #2 Plastics Includes hampers, totes, milk cartons, cat litter buckets, etc.



Steel / Aluminum **Bottles & Cans** Paint cans are not accepted.



Pots & Pans Remove glass lids before recycling. Ceramics are not accepted.





Glass Bottles & Jars All colors accepted. No window panes, mirrors, dishware or bakeware.



BEYOND THE BIN: ABOUT THE MATERIALS RECOVERY FACILITY (MRF)

The RRRASOC Materials Recovery Facility (or MRF) is located at the northeast corner of Eight Mile and Evergreen Roads in Southfield. It was originally built in 1994 on the site of a vacant manufacturing facility and completed renovated in 2016.

The RRRASOC facility is a state-of-the-art single stream processing system that sorts, separates and bales recyclables collected from our nine member communities as well as regionally from other communities. Once baled, the recyclable commodities are sold and shipped locally, nationally and globally and are used as resources to make new products.

The MRF can process up to 20 tons of recyclable material per hour from residential curbside recycling programs, commercial and industrial businesses and items collected from RRRASOC's two recycling drop-off sites.



PREPARING YOUR RECYCLABLES

As technology improves, we have been able to require much less preparation of the recyclables for pick-up. No longer must a resident remove labels or caps from food containers.

Here are a few tips on how to make your recycling as easy as possible:

- Please rinse containers. We're not looking for perfection; we just want to keep odors and pest problems at a minimum.
- ✔ Labels do not need to be removed.
- ✓ Keep caps on plastic bottles and containers.
- Keep recyclables LOOSE in your bin or cart or in the recycling drop-off site containers. DO NOT BAG RECYCLABLES. Plastic bags and recyclables in bags are removed and thrown away.
- ✓ Flatten cardboard or paperboard boxes, to allow for more space in your bin/cart.

RECYCLE RIGHT. IT MATTERS. #FightRecyclingContamination

We need your help! Unacceptable items — such as garden hoses, plastic bags, diapers, needles, medical waste, propane tanks, and batteries as well as yard and food waste expose employees at the recycling facility to unsafe materials, lower productivity and reduce the quality of recyclable materials. This increases the costs of recycling operations and lowers the value of your recyclables.

HOW WELL IS MICHIGAN RECYCLING?


Michigan's 21% recycling rate is one of the lowest in the region and well below the 32% national recycling average. For recycling to work, each of us must commit to recycling where we live, work and play.

We can make a difference by reducing, reusing, and recycling materials at home, school, work and in our communities.

Encourage your family, friends, neighbors and co-workers to do the same. If recycling isn't available, take the initiative to make it happen.

Recycling is Important because...


- Much of our waste can be used to create new products instead of being buried and lost in a landfill.
- Recycling supports our local and state economy.
- Recycling conserves natural resources, reduces greenhouse gas emissions, and reduces air and water pollution.



REGIONAL RECYCLING RATES

HOW DOES OUR RATE COMPARE?

The RRRASOC member communities collectively have a recycling rate of approximately 35%, and consistently divert more than 35,000 tons annually from landfill disposal through recycling, composting, Simple Recycling textile program and household hazardous waste collection events.



SIMPLE RECYCLING CURBSIDE CLOTHING & TEXTILE RECYCLING

Clothing and textiles are 100% recyclable, but 85% still ends up in landfills. Residents in all 9 RRRASOC member communities can recycle unwanted clothing, shoes, accessories, and other household items such as kitchenware, tools, toys, and books through *Simple Recycling:* an easy, free, and convenient way to keep this 100% recyclable and reusable material out of landfills!

The *Simple Recycling* program is in addition to your current recycling program. Your recycling cart/bin collection will remain the same. Don't live in a community serviced by *Simple Recycling*? We encourage you to donate your unwanted clothing to your favorie charity or secondhand store! We provide a list of local charitable organizations on our **Reuse/Repurpose** page, including those who offer at-home pickup.



HOW DOES THE SIMPLE RECYCLING PROGRAM WORK?

 Schedule a pickup by completing the form available on our Clothing & Textile Recycling page or at SimpleRecycling.com.



- Place clothing, shoes, and small household items that you no longer need in a waterproof bag or box clearly marked "SIMPLE RECYCLING".
- Leave it on your front porch or in front of your garage door by 7:30am on your scheduled pickup day and Simple Recycling will collect them and recycle their contents for reuse!



GOT HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) includes products used in and around your home, garden, and garage that contain ingredients that, when handled and disposed improperly, can cause harm to people and the environment.

These products have the following characteristics: *Corrosivity; Toxicity; Flammability; Reactivity*. Warnings on labels such as "poisonous or toxic", "flammable or ignitable", or "corrosive" are indicators that the items should be disposed of as HHW. Cleaners that contain strong acids, bleach or ammonia are also hazardous, as is oil-based paint.

RRRASOC provides household hazardous waste events yearly in several of our member communities to help residents properly and safely dispose of household hazardous waste materials.

CAN'T MAKE IT TO THE HHW EVENTS?

MEDICINE DISPOSAL

The proper disposal of unused or expired medications protects the environment and human health and safety.

With the abuse of prescription medicine on the rise, it is important to promptly and properly dispose of unused, expired medications. Use one of the options below to reduce the risk of people improperly consuming or handling medications.



WHAT SHOULD YOU DO WITH UNWANTED/EXPIRED MEDICATIONS?

Do NOT flush medications down the drain or toilet.

Medicines flushed down the drain or toilet pass through waste water treatment plants. These facilities do not treat water for such chemicals, which end up directly in our lakes and streams.

Do NOT throw medications in the trash.

Medicines disposed in landfills can potentially seep into and contaminate surrounding groundwater.

Check with your pharmacy to see if they have a drug take back program.

Bring unwanted medicine to a RRRASOC Household Hazardous Waste Event.


